Fort McMurray fires - The fire that ravaged Fort McMurray began on May 1; the outpouring of prayers, donations and interest in serving continues. While the focus of that fire has been the devastation it caused in the city, the fire is still burning 6 weeks later. MDS will make an initial assessment visit to Fort McMurray and the surrounding area on June 19-21. Rebuilding efforts will only begin after an extensive cleanup of hazardous ash within the city.

RMC Semi-Annual Meeting Highlights June 12, 2016

There were 60 members and 3 adherents in attendance. Ted Janzen chaired the meeting, and encouraged us to be a creative, prophetic and hopeful church as we move forward.

Motion by Paulette Booker to accept the minutes of the RMC Annual Meeting, January 17, 2016. Carried.

The Financial Statement to the end of May 2016 was presented. 42% of the year has passed, but only 41% of our budget has been raised. **Motion** by Linda Bartel to accept the financial report as presented. Carried.

Constitutional changes stipulating that members of the Pastoral Committee must be members of Rosthern Mennonite Church, while all other committee positions were open to members and adherents, were voted on and carried.

The congregation was asked if there was a willingness to sponsor 1 or 2 additional male refugees who have connections to our current Karen families. After discussion it was decided people interested in supporting the refugees would indicate by pledge in the ballot box by next Sunday (June 19, 2016)
