Responsive Scripture Reading

Leader:

...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Pay to all what is due them - taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due. (Gal. 5:22-23; Romans 13:7)

People:

But, owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet" and any other commandment, is summed up in this, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law. (Romans 13:8-10)

Leader:

I give you a new commandment - to love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. Everyone will know by this that you are my disciples - if you have love for one another. (1 John 3:34-35)

People:

We know that we have come to know God if we keep God's commandments. And this is God's command: to believe in the name of God's Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as Jesus commanded us. (1 John 2:3; 1 John 3:23)

Leader:

If you really keep the royal law found in scripture, "Love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing right. (James 2:8)

People:

This is how we know who the children of God are and who the children of the devil are: anyone who does not do what is right is not God's child, nor is anyone who does not *love* brother and sister. (1 John 3:10)

Leader:

But if any obey God's word, love for God is truly made complete in them... Those who love brother and sister live in the light, and there is nothing in them to make them stumble. Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. (1 John 2:5,10; 1 John 4:20)

People:

We know that we have passed from death to life, because we *love* each other. Anyone who does not *love* remains in death. (1 John 3:14)

Leader:

This is the message you heard from the beginning: We should love one another. This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. (1 John 3:11; 1 John 3:16)

People:

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. (1 John 4:7)

Leader:

Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and truth. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. (1 John 3:18; 1 John 4:8)

People:

If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. (1 John 3:17; 1 John 4:10)

Leader:

Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. (1 John 4:11)

All:

We love because he first loved us. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear. (1 John 4:18,19)
