Mennonite Heritage Museum, Rosthern

The Mennonite Heritage Museum in Rosthern embarked on a renewal of the museum to better reflect best practices for museums as well as incorporating an Anabaptist/ Mennonite Interpretive Room. The Interpretive Room is in the midst of an addition: the first Mennonite sanctuary in Rosthern has been donated to the Museum by the New Church congregation and will be moved to a site adjacent to the museum. This building will be preserved as an historic artefact and a memoriam to the faith pioneers of Saskatchewan.

The changes basically respond to these goals, among others:

- 1) To tell the story of Mennonite faith and settlement in the Saskatchewan Valley more informatively,
- 2) To improve our ability to be a better museum for Rosthern and District's multicultural history,
- 3) To present a comprehensive story of Rosthern Junior College.

The Interpretive Room is well underway but still in progress.

On August 12 & 13, we are going to hold an OPEN HOUSE in order to let people see the progress to date and to advise us on what they would like to see.
