Rosthern Mennonite Church Annual Meeting Highlights Sunday, January 22, 2017

There were 49 members and 4 adherents in attendance. Ted Janzen chaired the meeting. He reminded us that God will always be with us. Our task is to plant the seed and trust in God to supply the rest, so that "hope, joy, grace and God's love will flow through us to the world".

Committee, pastor and related organization reports are found in the January 22, 2017 Annual Report.

Motion: That we accept the budget of \$184,000 as presented for the year 2017. Carried.

Motion: That we appoint Cogent Chartered Professional Accountants as auditor for Rosthern Mennonite Church for 2017 if needed. Carried.

Motion: That we appoint Kathy Luitjens and Lloyd Schmidt as cotreasurers for RMC for 2017. Carried.

Motion: That the Constitution Committee vacancy be filled by appointment from Council. Carried.

Proposed Constitutional changes as noted in the Annual Report booklet were voted on and carried.

Challenges for the coming year include how to effectively budget with a smaller membership, while maintaining facilities and programs. Discussions focused on the cumulative deficit shortfall and ongoing budget concerns, potential fundraising ideas, and increased giving. A recent Revenue Canada audit of RMC's 2014 and 2015 financials indicated no major issues.

The congregation was encouraged to attend the upcoming Deeper Life Services, and to make topic suggestions for future Sunday School classes that they feel would help them in their faith journey.

Rosthern Mennonite Church (jointly with the Mennonite Nursing Home) will host an IVEP intern (Wang Yixian from China) from October 2017 to July 2018. A volunteer host family and individual financial sponsorship were graciously offered (outside of the 2017 budget). Jeanette Hanson will work with her schedule.

We were reminded how drastic the situation is for millions of refugees in the world today, and encouraged to be intentional about inviting the newest refugee families to our church. The Rosthern Community Group is still looking for more funding for Kee Lah who has not yet arrived, and help with financing a young single man from Eritrea (with MCC).

Delegates are needed for the MC Sask Conference on March 10 & 11, 2017. Contact the Church Office if you are interested.

Motion: That all ballots be destroyed. Carried. Meeting adjourned.
