PRAISE AND CONCERNS:

In March, the Rosthern Ministerial Association asks us to pray for the Rivers Christian Ministry, and for all who seek sanctuary.

Prayer requests from Mennonite Church Saskatchewan:

Pray for our leaders, medical and emergency people, and others who continue to work to keep us safe as we go through this time of uncertainty and turmoil. May all feel Christ's peace and comfort, knowing he is with us.

The Colombian Mennonite Church ask us to pray for peace in Colombia. Although there has been a peace plan signed with the FARC forces (Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia), they report an increase in threats and violence against peasant leaders and pastors in some areas. Pray that God's peace that transforms lives will reign in this region.

In the last few weeks Pastor Siaka Troare from Burkina Faso, chair of the Deacons Commission for Mennonite World Conference (MWC), has been speaking in several places in Manitoba and Alberta. He urges us to pray for peace as terrorist groups randomly kill people gathered in churches, mosques and markets. After a visit from the MWC leadership to prav for groups in Burkina Faso, the head of the military said that this cannot be changed by military force but only by prayer that God will transform the hearts and minds of these groups. Pray that God's power of transformative love will flood this land.

As the COVID-19 emergency begins to ease for Witness workers in China and South Korea, Dann and Joji Pantoja in Mindanao, Philippines report the beginning of their time of self-isolation. They report on the devastating effects

Lent is often thought of as a dry, desert experience, when our doubts, laments, admissions of failure are more welcome and given the chance to be expressed. Sand, rocks, bare branches, burlap, and the absence of flowers help to show the feeling of the emptiness of this season of the church year. We begin with six purple candles, for the six Sundays of Lent, scattered among a few bare branches. Purple is the liturgical color of repentance. Each week one more candle will be extinguished to the darkness of Good Friday.

In John 12 Jesus speaks of how new life comes from the death of a seed. Seeds planted in baskets among the rocks represent the hope that will spring forth with new life, the resurrection to come. Seeds, like us, nurtured by God's loving warmth for growth. Seeds, like us, nurtured to produce fruit.
